Dear Parishioners,

I am glad to be announcing that we will be opening our Churches for public Masses and once again celebrating marriages and baptisms as well as holding funeral Masses at our parishes.

The last 3 months have seemed like a very long difficult time, and the Churches have been so empty. I will be happy to see you, when you can come, either for Mass, or just for Holy Communion. We are going to start slowly, and I ask your patience and understanding as you review the schedule below. Because of the limitations of the number of people attending, there probably will be times when you still will not be able to attend Mass, but at least there are 2 opportunities where you can receive communion on Sunday morning, either at Sacred Heart at 9:30am or St. Pio's at 11:30am.

The obligation to attend Mass remains suspended and we will continue to Live Stream our Sunday morning mass (at 8:30am) and continue to distribute Holy Communion at both churches the way we have been for the last two weeks (see times below).

We will begin celebrating a very limited number of public Masses beginning the week of June 8th at both Sacred Heart and St Pio's Churches. Our weekend assistant priest availability is very limited in this time of COVID-19. As time progresses this summer, we see how well things work and don't work, the schedules will be adjusted, again depending on the availability of priests, and what's going on regarding public gatherings

Our <u>Summer Mass Schedule</u> for now: the schedule will then repeat for the next few weeks, at least until the first week of July.

Funeral masses can now be scheduled at one of the Churches at 9:30 AM or 11:30 AM. Please ask the Funeral Home to call our Parish Office to make arrangements. At least a few of our families have not been able to hold funeral Masses for their loved ones who have died, which is an important part of our grieving process, not to mention the spiritual benefits for the deceased. I am sorry that situation existed.

WEDDINGS

Weddings will also resume on the weekend of June 13th.
