




Each year we have mandatory payments due to the diocese. This represents 14% of our income.

#### Loans to Other Parishes:

Our parish makes low-interest, long-term loans to other parishes in our diocese that are in need of funds for church building projects. Our current portfolio of loans is: \$722,000.

#### **Parish Savings Accounts:**

All our savings accounts are prudently and conservatively invested and managed by Morgan Stanley advisors. Our investments are screened to only be in accounts that follow Catholic Values and Moral Teaching as instructed by the United States Council of Catholic Bishops (USCCB).



### Ways to Support:

### **QCD Tax-Free Giving from your IRA**

After age 73 you can withdraw from your IRA (part of your Required Minimum Distribution) a gift directly to our church (Qualified Charitable Distribution) without recognizing the income (no tax!).

Several of your fellow parishioners have already taken advantage of this idea, contributing directly from their IRA to our parish (some do it in lieu of their weekly donations). If you would like more information about how to do this or how we can split your donation between our parish and our other charities (Special Collections, Holiday & Holy Day Collections, Flowers, the Annual Catholic Appeal, etc.) please call our parish Business Manager.

### Remember us in your Will:

Thanks to several Bequests (funds given through a will) received from a variety of parishioners, they have funded many of our facilities projects and investments for the future. We are grateful to have received bequests between 2021-2024 totaling \$299,301.

Giving a sum of money through your will is as simple as adding a statement to your will similar to:

I give and devise to The Church of the Sacred Heart, located in Bay Head, NJ, the sum of \$\_\_\_\_\_ (or asset) to be used for its general support.

We also accept Charitable Stock Transfers. We are thankful to have received stock transfers between 2021-2024 totaling over \$30,000.



#### ONLINE

We encourage you to use our Parish Giving online giving system if you are able. By automating your giving through either a credit card or debit to your checking or savings account, you can prayerfully choose a giving level you are comfortable with and "set it and forget it". This way your donation comes to us whether you are able to attend each week or while you are away. It gives the parish a more even, reliable level of income over the course of the year, and it relieves the burden of having to manually count and deposit cash and checks each week.
